GREEK GOD/GODDESS PROJECT

For the next few weeks you will be researching a god or goddess.

CIRCLE ONE:

- Trading Card/ Poster
- Power Point

REQUIRED:

- **Costume:** Put together a costume to wear while you present your project to the class. You should be dressed as your god/goddess. They were often shown wearing togas (a sheet could work for this)
- **Prop:** Make a prop that goes with your god/ goddess (ex. Trident, lightning bolt, wings, etc.) Be creative. Use materials around your home. (Try not to go out and buy a prop)

You can make a "trading card" for a god/goddess that contains the following information:

FRONT OF CARD

- a- God/Goddess **Greek Name** – correctly labeled
- b- A **picture** of the God/Goddess (*The picture must be clear. It could be a drawing, piece of clip art, photo of an ancient statue or painting or magazine clipping- be creative!*)

BACK OF CARD

- a- Relationship to other gods or famous mortals. (Give the names of parents, brothers, sisters, and/or children. *Be thorough!*)
- b- Domain or Realm: What is this god/goddess in charge of? There may be more than one area. (*sky, travelers, etc.*)
- c- Symbols: What objects are identified with each god/goddess? Each god or goddess will probably have more than one symbol.
- d- Story about god/goddess. Write at least 3-4 sentences summarizing a story about this god/goddess

CARD FORMATTING: Card design is up to you but should meet the following standards.

- **Card size** must be 8.5" x 11" *or larger*
- The cards should be of **sturdy paper stock** (e.g. heavy construction paper, poster board, or card-stock paper)
- **Neatness counts**. No visible glue or tape on your cards. Do NOT use staples.
- **Pictures should be attractive** and attention-getting. You will lose points for fuzzy internet pictures; don't blame your printer.
- **Spelling and grammar count!** Get help proofreading to avoid careless mistakes!
